The Peace Light from Bethlehem is

a continuously burning flame, originating from the Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem, Israel. It is meant to promote peace, harmony, and unity among people of the world regardless of race, ethnicity, or religion.

For several decades the International Scouting movement – both Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts – has actively promoted global peace and harmony through the distribution of the Peace Light, which has allowed the light to travel to over 30 European countries and the United States, Canada, and Mexico.

The Peace Light will arrive at St. Anne's at the 8 AM and 10 AM services on December 7. We are looking for Scouts to volunteer to help present the flame from Bethlehem. St. Anne's Vestry consists of 12 people in addition to the executive committee. Vestry members serve a 3-year term. Each year 4 people rotate off, and 4 new members start their 3-year terms. As a result, we are officially starting the process of accepting nominations for our 2026 Vestry.

If you or someone you know would like to submit their name for consideration to the Nominating Committee, please do so by December 7th to Mother Jess or James Brooks. The nominating committee consists of outgoing Vestry members, the Rector, Associate Rector, and Wardens, and they determine the slate of Vestry candidates.

## Interested in a National Cathedral Tour?

On Saturday, January 10th at 10AM, Emily Muha (who is a docent at Washington National Cathedral) has arranged private tours for St. Anne's Elementary age Sunday School youth (K-5th grade) and their family. Duration is approximately 1 hour, 30 minutes.



Two options are available for parents:

#### Option # 1

For the Sunday School Children (K-5th grade), Emily will lead a scavenger hunt throughout the Cathedral to find surprising critters and creatures. The scavenger hunt will feature picture clues and a map to find hidden animals like butterflies, dinosaurs, and panda cubs in the Cathedral's artwork. Cost per child is \$12. Cost per Parent joining child on Scavenger hunt is \$17.

#### Option #2 for parents:

While your child is on scavenger hunt throughout the cathedral with Emily Muha, parents have an option of going on a private Behind the Scenes tour of the cathedral with Dora Currea (a fabulous long time docent at the cathedral). Discover the Cathedral's hidden stories as you marvel at the building's artistry and engineering. Journey through stone stairwells and passageways to see stained glass windows up close and magnificent views. Cost for Parent for the Behind the Scenes Tour is \$40.

The Option #2 tour is:

- Not for those with fear of heights or those with limited mobility. All participants must be able to climb stairs. Be prepared for a variety of spaces that include close quarters, dim lighting, stair climbing, and heights.
- All participants must be at least 11 years old; those aged 11 to 17 must be accompanied by an adult. Infants cannot be carried on Behind the Scenes Tours.
- By purchasing tickets for a Behind the Scenes Tour, you acknowledge that you and everyone in your party are physically able to participate in the tour.

- Thursday, April 9



A brilliant collection, Mere Christianity remains strikingly fresh for the modern reader and at the same time confirms C. S. Lewis's reputation as one of the leading writer and thinkers of our age.




