### Stewardship Update

With our pledge campaign reaching its end, thank you to everyone for the \$770,193 pledged by our congregation in support of our 2026 budget. We are blessed by this response! The shortfall of about \$23,000 to our goal feels like a number we can reach over the next week or so.

- Our total pledges of \$770,193 includes recurring payments (meaning payments established last year or before and have rolled into this year). We ask that anyone who has recurring payments please [reach out to Angie](#) to confirm that you intend this payment to be your 2026 pledge. These folks have received an email reminder.

While the gap of \$23,000 against our full church budget may seem slight, it could mean a readjustment to our 2026 budget outlook and we'd like to protect all of those needs and plans for our church. We're SO CLOSE and together we can close this gap and reach our goal!

## St. Anne's Inclement Weather Policy

*A decision will be made on whether to hold worship services or not on Sunday morning. Please be looking for an email from St. Anne's around 7:00 AM this Sunday to either confirm or cancel services.*



Clergy are committed to making every reasonable effort to hold worship services. Rest assured that we will be watching the weather this weekend and will send an email out around 7:00 AM this Sunday to let you know whether services will be held or not so please be sure to check your email before heading to St. Anne's Sunday morning. Either way, please always use your best judgement on whether you should get out in bad weather. And be safe out there!

As a reminder, St. Anne's operates on the same schedule as Fairfax County Public schools when it comes to inclement weather.

- If schools are closed for the day, all activities at St. Anne's are canceled and the office is closed.
- If schools open late, morning activities are canceled and the office will open at noon.
- If schools close early, activities in the evening are canceled.
- If schools cancel activities over the weekend, all Sunday School classes and other special programs are canceled.


If you have a pastoral emergency when the office is closed on a bad weather day, the best way to reach us is to call the church office and leave a message. The phone is monitored throughout the day.



St. Anne's Youth Group is usually held on the first and third Sundays of every month from 4 to 5:30 but because of school calendars, our next meeting will be February 8.



Admission is free, but donations to expand the reach of the St. Anne's Food Pantry will be gratefully accepted. You won't want to miss this fun performance for all ages!




## Adult Formation: Painting the Stars

## Food Pantry January Distribution

The St. Anne's Food Pantry began the New Year on a very strong note! At the January food distribution, the Pantry provided food to 141 families with 412 family members. Forty-eight of the families were new to the St. Anne's Food Pantry.

Among the 412 family members, there were 145 children, 167 adults and 100 senior citizens. The Food Pantry provided these families with 211 pre-packed bags of groceries, fresh produce, frozen meat, personal hygiene products and a wide variety of food choice items such as flour, sugar, cooking oil and soy sauce. We were able to provide this food and other items thanks to the hard work of the Food Pantry volunteers and the strong financial support from the St. Anne's Congregation.



Since the huge distribution in September, our number of customers for diapers dropped off through December. However we had a welcome surge this month. We had 58 customers that were served with 77 packages of diapers. Thanks to your generosity we met the demand without any worries.


We worked with volunteers from Epiphany and FACETS to provide a warm meal, a warm place to stay, and a spirited football watch party on a very cold night!


Due to considerable peanut allergies in the congregation, we appreciate at least one week's notice if you plan to bring something with peanuts in it.
