Gift Card Drive Still Needs Sponsors





Monday mornings via Zoom

The book club started a new book last Monday but it's not too late to join. The book is *Matthew The Gospel of Promised Blessings* by Matthew Skinner. This six-part exploration of an enigmatic Gospel takes readers into the themes, topics, and tensions at the heart of Matthew's story about the life and work of Jesus. Chapters focus on blessing and comfort, judgment and retribution, the meaning of discipleship, Jesus' vision for the Church and world, conflicts and complaints, and how the Gospel of Matthew speaks to believers today.

Mtr. Jess shared that Bishop Stevenson's keynote address was both riveting and deeply inspiring, and that the various sessions throughout the convention were rich with valuable information.

Honeydew Honey

As a result of the invasive spotted lanternfly St. Anne's was blessed to have a 3rd honey crop in the 2025 season! And, as it turns out, this honey is almost as medicinal as manuka honey. As much of a nuisance as the spotted lanternfly may be, the "tap" that it creates on the outside of trees (think maple syrup) attracts honeybees. They bring this sap or "honeydew" into the hive, and as result of their processing, it converts to honey. This honey does not have the same amino acids that traditional honey has, so in the beekeeping community we've been encouraged to refer to it as "honeydew," but it is honey all the same.
