Vestry Corner

On Sunday, January 25, Vestry met for their regularly scheduled meeting. Members discussed their favorite winter traditions and the "star words" they selected for 2026.

Each Vestry cohort gave an update on their projects and shared intentions for the new year. Vestry members also discussed some of the common themes coming out of the recent visioning sessions, such as a desire for more community events and addressing the current space constraints felt by several ministries by acquiring exclusive use of the Great Hall.

We also had the opportunity to meet Richie and Rachel Musser of Kirby-Smith Associates, who will be partnering with St. Anne's to lead a feasibility study. This study will help us better understand our capacity to pursue several of our long-term hopes and goals.

We will share possibilities such as gaining exclusive use of the Great Hall, expanding opportunities for fellowship, and exploring ways to make our memorial garden more accessible.



This 2021 documentary is a portrait of their impact as a non-binary Black luminary: lawyer, activist, poet, and priest who transformed our world.



The 7:00 PM service will have the choir with special music in addition to distribution of ashes and Holy Communion.




Adult Formation: Painting the Stars

Pathways to Prayer & Practice

We are excited to announce that St. Anne's will be one of 10 congregations that will participate in the first cohort of **Pathways to**



Prayer and Practice, an initiative of the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia, funded by a grant from the Lilly Endowment. This initiative supports congregations as they imagine new ways to more fully welcome children into worship, deepen faith at home, and grow intergenerational spiritual life.

Over the past several weeks, churches across the Diocese engaged in a multi-round application and discernment process. Leaders from a wide range of communities expressed a shared longing to center children in worship and formation, along with a hopeful openness to experimentation and learning. We are grateful to Mother Kara for throwing our hat in the ring and getting accepted!

While the initial plan was to launch with five churches, the strength of the applications and the momentum across the Diocese led to a faithful decision to expand the first cohort to 10 congregations. This expansion reflects the clear readiness among our congregations and a desire to respond faithfully to the Spirit-led energy already present in this work.

In addition to St. Anne's, following are the other 9 churches that have committed to join the inaugural cohort:




