

We encourage two ways to donate:

• Donate a box of food. Pick up an empty box at St. Anne's after any Sunday service between now and November 16th and go shopping and fill the box with the items on the shopping list provided below and return it to church by November 16 before 3PM. Gift cards from a grocery store valued at \$25 should be placed in an envelope and labeled "Thanksgiving Box" and left in the office with Angie or Sheri.

3 cans vegetables (no green beans)
2 cans fruit
1 bottle olive or canola oil (24 oz)
■ 1 box instant potatoes, stuffing, or mac & cheese
☐ 1 box or 2.5 lb. bag rice
1 box biscuit or muffin mix
1 (1-2 lb) bag dried beans or lentils
☐ 1 box dessert mix - cake, cookies, etc.
2 lb. bag flour
2 lb. bag sugar
\$25 grocery store gift card (place in an envelope and leave in church office)

Food Pantry & Diaper Update

FOOD

The St. Anne's Food Pantry provided grocery bags packed with non-perishable food, fresh produce, frozen meat, assorted frozen foods, toilet paper, paper towels, cooking oil, spices and other extras to 129 families at the Pantry's monthly food distribution on October 16. The 129 families who were provided food have 395 family members total, including 150 children, 138 adults and 107 senior citizens. The families live primarily in Reston and Herndon.



DIAPERS

We haven't yet decoded the ebb and flow of diaper demand as each month is a surprise. After last month's record-breaking demand, things seemed a bit subdued this month. We served 48 customers with 72 packages of diapers. That's still a lot of diapers! We ran out of wipes about halfway through and size 7 toward the end. We had not fully restocked from last month's almost total wipeout. We currently need sizes 3 through 6. Size 7 is used for nighttime only and parents will take 6 instead, but 7 is requested and nice to have.

VOLUNTEERS

The efforts of the St. Anne's Food Pantry, both during the monthly food distribution as well

as leading up to the monthly event, would not be possible without the fantastic work and dedication of the Food Pantry volunteers, and we are grateful for every person that steps up to help! The majority of the volunteers who staff the food distribution are members of the St. Anne's congregation. A number of these volunteers from the congregation have been doing work for the Food Pantry for a number of years, some since the Food Pantry was founded in 2011. In addition, several of the volunteers at this food distribution included disabled adults and staff from the local office of SPARC (Specially Adapted Resource Centers). And some of the volunteers are Reston residents who very much want to participate in the work of providing food to those who need it. In addition, approximately a half dozen of the volunteers were persons who came to the distribution in order to receive food and volunteered to help in the distribution.

Again, we are so grateful to each and every one of you who pick up food, donate food/diapers, and step in to assist on Pantry Day! Thank you all so much for your incredible generosity!
