


Fall Fellowship Save the Date



St. Anne's has a YouTube Channel!

Hurry! Sign Up to Receive Your St. Anne's Honey if You Haven't Already!

The honey has been extracted and is now being filtered, allowing time for air to naturally rise and ensuring the moisture level is within ranges recommended by the USDA.

Between now and August 15, 2025, you can request a 4-5oz spice-jar-size of St. Anne Episcopal Church Reston's honey! We will likely have a jar for everyone that requests one, but to help us reserve one for you, please click here to complete the form.



The honey will be blessed and distributed at the 8am and 10am services on Sunday, August 17, the day after National Honeybee Day. If there are extra jars of honey available after every St. Anne's household has received one, we will let you know and make them available after Thanksgiving/before Christmas. We request a \$5-10 donation per jar which goes directly to the St. Anne's honey ministry. Payment/your donation is collected when you pick up your jar of honey.

EFM and Adult Formation at St. Anne's

Education For Ministry (EfM) is a unique four-year, small-group formation program based on study and practice in theological reflection. Since its founding in 1975, this international program has helped over 120,000 participants discover and nurture their call to Christian service in their daily lives, where they live, work, and play. EfM helps the faithful explore our Christian tradition, bringing it into conversation with their experiences of the world. EfM seminar groups develop theologically informed, reflective, and



articulate seekers of God. EFM has undergone a comprehensive curriculum redesign, and this year we will be implementing the new curriculum.

St. Anne's is blessed to have an active EFM program that meets on Tuesday evenings from 7-9 PM and is conducted 100% online using ZOOM. This adult formation opportunity has a long, rich history at St. Anne's and we are preparing for a new seminar session starting in early September 2025.
