June Pantry Update

The St. Anne's Food Pantry provided food to 111 families at the monthly food distribution on Thursday, June 18th. The 111 families have 346 members, including 110 children, 163 adults and 73 senior citizens. The food provided included pre-packed grocery bags of non-perishable food items, fresh produce, frozen meat and a wide variety of choice items.

Our food pantry has greatly expanded the offering of choice items over the past 18 months in response to a survey that we conducted among the neighbors who come to us

for food. Our neighbors indicated that they preferred a variety of food items that we could obtain in smaller quantities and then provide in a choice model that would allow our neighbors to select those food items they preferred.

In addition to food, the team served 42 customers with 54 packages of diapers. The sizes most in demand were 5 and 6.

The Rev'd Canon Dr. J. Lee Hill, Jr., has been called to be Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of Virginia and will simultaneously serve in the newly created role of Dean of the Diocesan Ministry for Racial Justice and Healing.

Hill previously served as the diocese's first Canon for Racial Justice and Healing. By assigning the new Canon to the Ordinary a broader racial justice and healing role, Bishop Stevenson signals the diocese's strong emphasis on these ministries.

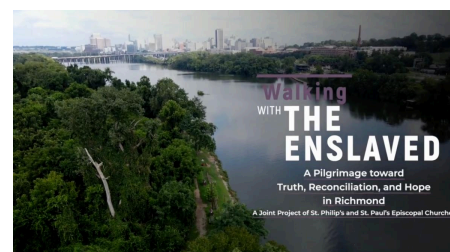
Marta and Tim Michell, who are part of the Advocacy Ministry, have been drivers for Food Justice DMV for a month. This summer, Food Justice DMV is asking for help with drivers in Herndon, Springfield and Woodbridge.

It is possible that current drivers volunteer to shift locations as well, so if new drivers want to help in locations closer to their home, current drivers might make changes and shift to new, underserved areas.

Marta and Tim show up at a specified church every Tuesday, collect food and some baby supplies, and deliver to assigned families. They are usually finished in a few hours. There are many protocols to protect the identities of food recipients and those volunteering.

Vote Faithfully

Early voting started last Friday, June 19, for Virginia's primary election on August 4.

In the general election November 3, Virginians will vote on a US senator, members of the US House of Representatives, local offices and three constitutional amendments. Voter in the primary will choose their party's nominee for US Senate and member of Congress.



Not all offices have competitive primaries. Check with your county office of elections for a sample ballot and early voting locations and hours.

July 24 is the deadline to register to vote, update your registration or request a ballot by mail.
