The word is meant to be your word for the year - a word to reflect on, a word to strive for, a word to challenge you, and a word to inspire you.

Following are some questions to help you in your journey:

- What synonyms are there for your word?
- Where can you find your word in Scripture? Which Scripture passage is your favorite? Do any of these passages make you cringe?
- What is the antonym for your word, noting that it is important to understand the void that exists when your word is not present?
- How does your word help you to understand the sacraments of communion and baptism?
- What hymn embodies your word?
- How does your word enhance worship, devotion, spiritual formation, and discipleship?



Star Words Prayer:

God, we acknowledge that we are not always ready to receive your best gifts for us. You have given us an epiphany word in order that our searching will bring us to you. It is often our habit to turn aside, stumble over, or even reject experiences and encounters that we later understand to have been precious gifts. Help us to be open to the gift that you offer us now through our star words. We acknowledge that we do not fully understand what this word might mean for our faith, but we receive it from you with gratitude and pray that your Spirit will enable us to live into our word with intention and faithfulness. Pantry Update

At the December food distribution the St. Anne's Food Pantry provided pre-packed bags of groceries, frozen meat, fresh produce and a wide variety of food choice items to 119 families total. These families had 327 family members, including 98 children, 120 adults and 109 senior citizens. The Food Pantry was able to provide this food thanks to the hard work of 47 volunteers and the generosity of the St. Anne's congregation in providing funding for the food pantry. To all of you volunteers and congregation members, please accept our gratitude.



Also at the December pantry we served 37 customers and distributed 56 packages of diapers. Many customers are asking others to pick up diapers for them. Customers come to the pantry with their friends' cards as well as their own. We were also able to offer toys and children's gently used clothing. They were very appreciative.

We are out of the various types of baby formula and had some requests for it. The basic pantry baby items are diapers and wipes; everything else is a bonus, but it's nice to offer baby food items when we have them.

Interested in a National Cathedral Tour?

This Saturday, January 10 at 10:00AM

This Saturday, January 10th at 10AM, Emily Muha (who is a docent at Washington National Cathedral) has arranged private tours for St. Anne's Elementary age Sunday School youth (K-5th grade) and their family. Duration is approximately 1 hour, 30 minutes.

Two options are available for parents:

Option # 1

For the Sunday School Children (K-5th grade), Emily will lead a scavenger hunt throughout the Cathedral to find surprising critters and creatures. The scavenger hunt will feature picture clues and a map to find hidden animals like butterflies, dinosaurs, and panda cubs in the Cathedral's artwork. Cost per child is \$12. Cost per Parent joining child on Scavenger hunt is \$17.

Option #2 for parents:

While your child is on scavenger hunt throughout the cathedral with Emily Muha, parents have an option of going on a private Behind the Scenes tour of the cathedral with Dora Currea (a fabulous long time docent at the cathedral). Discover the Cathedral's hidden stories as you marvel at the building's artistry and engineering. Journey through stone stairwells and passageways to see stained glass windows up close and magnificent views. Cost for Parent for the Behind the Scenes Tour is \$40.

The Option #2 tour is:

- Not for those with fear of heights or those with limited mobility. All participants must be able to climb stairs. Be prepared for a variety of spaces that include close quarters, dim lighting, stair climbing, and heights.



- All participants must be at least 11 years old; those aged 11 to 17 must be accompanied by an adult. Infants cannot be carried on Behind the Scenes Tours.
- By purchasing tickets for a Behind the Scenes Tour, you acknowledge that you and everyone in your party are physically able to participate in the tour.
