Vestry Corner

Vestry met on Sunday for their regularly scheduled meeting. Our stewardship chairs, Bernadette Capelle and Rosie Horn, shared an update on our pledge campaign. As of today, we are at 79% of our goal of \$795,000.

Our Treasurer, Karl Hafer, presented our draft budget for 2026. In addition, our pantry manager, Glen Corso and inventory manager, Bernadette Capelle, provided a special presentation about the incredible work the pantry is doing.



They spoke on the growing food insecurity in our area and their vision for the future of the pantry.

Mtr Jess shared about the ongoing vision process and the tremendous energy that is present in the sessions. Leadership is exploring ways to embody the new ideas coming out of these discussions.

St. Anne's Vestry consists of 12 people in addition to the executive committee. Vestry members serve a 3-year term. Each year 4 people rotate off, and 4 new members start their 3-year terms. As a result, we are officially starting the process of accepting nominations for our 2026 Vestry.

If you or someone you know would like to submit their name for consideration to the Nominating Committee, please do so by December 7th to Mother Jess or James Brooks. The nominating committee consists of outgoing Vestry members, the Rector, Associate Rector, and Wardens, and they determine the slate of Vestry candidates.

November Pantry Update

FOOD:

At the November food distribution the St. Anne's Food Pantry provided 190 pre-packed grocery bags, fresh produce, frozen meat, fresh eggs and a very large variety of choice items to 131 families with 391 family members. The families we provided food to have 117 children, 162 adults and 112 Senior Citizens. The number of families and family members provided with food are very similar to the October food distribution, slightly below those we served in September and 15% higher than those we served in August.



For December, we are anticipating very strong demand and our food supplies have been strengthened by very generous donations from members of the St. Anne's congregation. We are incredibly grateful for these donations and have been able to provide food, diapers and other items to those we serve. In addition we have steadily expanded the number of choice items we provide to our neighbors and the outpouring of donations from the congregation have greatly assisted our efforts to give our neighbors more choice in what they receive from St. Anne's Food Pantry. Thank you also to our volunteers for the hard work they put in that makes this all possible. We are blessed with a group of very

dedicated and conscientious volunteers whose hard work, attention to detail and empathy allow all of this wonderful work to be accomplished.

DIAPERS:

The Diaper Team distributed packs of diapers to 51 customers, some of them picking up for another family as well as for themselves. We handed out 65 packets of diapers and one pack of wipes for each family. The demand was less than we had prepared for but we were very pleased that we could meet the needs of every customer. We are excited about the next pantry where we can offer some nice, lightly used baby clothes. We do need to restock but there are no gaping holes. Sizes 3 through 6 is always appreciated. Thank you!



Mere Christianity explores the core beliefs of Christianity by providing an unequaled opportunity for believers and nonbelievers alike to hear a powerful, rational case for the Christian faith. A brilliant collection, Mere Christianity remains strikingly fresh for the modern reader and at the same time confirms C. S. Lewis's reputation as one of the leading writer and thinkers of our age.



The book brings together Lewis' legendary broadcast talks during World War II. Lewis discusses what everyone is curious about: right and wrong, human nature, morality, marriage, sins, forgiveness, faith, hope, generosity, and kindness.


Monday Morning Book Club
